WHAT IS SELF-DETERMINATION IN MARYLAND?

Starting with an initiative in 1997, Maryland has promoted self-determination. Self-determination helps support people with developmental disabilities in their communities in lives they have chosen.

Self-determination is:

- taking control of your life
- thinking and learning about choices you have and trying out these choices
- making and following through on goals with a vision of your future
- knowing where to get or having information to make good decisions
- having supports and services that help you achieve your goals and choices
- changing your goals and choices when you need to
- having the power to exercise adult rights and responsibilities
- having the opportunity to be active in the community
- deciding how to spend the money that supports you

Maryland is building towards a person directed system that:

- plans and coordinates flexible supports and services that help people live their dreams
- determines quality by asking people if they are happy with the supports and services they receive and if they have outcomes they want
- supports people and their families to decide on how to spend budgeted funds
- pays for supports and services a person wants, needs, and receives rather than only paying for existing program models
